

Cookie Policy

Cookies are widely used on sites to help provide you with improved performance and a better user experience. Cookies are small pieces of information, or text files which are stored on your computer or mobile phone when you visit a site. They remember your username and preferences so when you revisit the site, they enable the information to be more tailored and useful based on your last visit.

We do not use cookies to gather any personal information and we do not disclose information obtained through cookies to third parties. Cookies cause no harm to systems or devices.

Your Permission to Use Cookies

If the settings on your browser are adjusted to accept cookies, we take this, and your continued use of our site, to mean that you are happy to have cookies enabled and agree to this cookie policy.

Cookies used on our site

First party Cookies - are standard default cookies created every time a user accesses a site. They help to improve performance and create a better user experience.

Third party Cookies - we facilitate the opportunity to engage with us further through social media channels such as Twitter and LinkedIn. We do this by using ShareThis which allows the user to share content over different social networks and tracks the content viewed and shared. These cookies last over a year and help market research and analysis of traffic patterns and surveys to understand customer preferences.

Session Cookies - such as wfv# and wordfence remember your submitted data whilst you are in the site. These cookies only operate during your session and are erased when you finish browsing the site.

Google Analytics - _ga, _gat, _gid and collect gather information about the way people use our sites such as the number of visitors, where visitors have come to the site from and the pages they visited. The cookies _gat, _gid and collect only last during your session in the site. The cookie _ga lasts for two years so any return to the sites can be tracked and helps provide information to improve the site for future visits. The cookies collect information anonymously.
